S the car ascended Mount Ulu Kali, the shiny skyscrapers of Kuala Lumpur were left behind to make way for a verdant visual treat.

As we made our way to the peak, with multi-hued trees dotting the landscape, we thought of Tan Sri Lim Goh Tong, the man who had transformed this seemingly impregnable 6,000feet high mountain top, to make it what it is today.

It was sometime in the year 1937 that a young man of just 19 left the shores of his homeland in China in search of greener pastures and moved to a region that was then known as Malaya.

He was hard working and determined and did all sorts of jobs to earn a living and sustain his family. He worked as a carpenter, a farmer, a building sub-contractor and also dabbled in many petty businesses before he successfully established himself in the construction business and his company came to be regarded as one of the leading construction companies in Malaysia.

When Tong realised that Mount Ulu Kali was about an hours drive from Kuala Lumpur, an ambitious idea began to take shape. He quickly moved to give concrete shape to his vision, without care for the naysayers who questioned why he would want to develop a mountain peak that was not even accessible by road. His sagacity and determination saw him through, and soon, Genting Highlands Resort came to be, housing one hotel and a casino.

Today, the resort is an integrated and multi-dimensional leisure centre. *Genting Highlands* has metamorphosed into *Resorts World Genting*, a favoured destination for those looking to get away to a place that promises the high life and a cool climate.

As you approach the peak, gleaming red cable cars disappear into the clouds. At the top, amidst the clouds and overlooking a rainforest is a world which offers pure indulgence. There's food, shopping, leisure, luxury and adventure, all combined to make for an ideal family getaway.

One of the hotels in the resort — First World Hotel — is known to have the most number of rooms in the world. With 7,351 rooms, it's a tourist attraction by itself. The Theme Park Hotel, the first hotel built by Tong, has undergone a quirky makeover and stands as an arty and colourful property today. The room cost for a night at this 4-star hotel stands at 1,770MYR. The 5-star options, like Gentings Grand or Maxims, cost around 3,000MYR.

When you step out of these hotels,

it's easy to get lost in the intricate maze of the ritzy mall which offers shopping diverse experiences. At Sky Avenue, the best international brands vie with each other to grab eyeballs. The Times Square simulates stage atmosphere the of Times Square, York, New and showcases light and sound show every half which hour. is appropriately called Shy Symphony.

But if a show is what you want, you can catch a musical at the Arena of Stars where the likes of Lionel Richie and Olivia Newton-John have performed. The best way to explore the outdoors is to step into a glass bottomed gondola, which costs 33MYR per person, and glide down the hill while watching the forests rush past below. You can visit the Chin Swee, the Taoist temple nestled on a ridge, and the 130 million year old Awana Bio Park, which is a gateway to the rainforest, and houses exotic flora and fauna.

After all these experiences amidst the low hanging mist of the mountains, heading back to the bustle of Kuala Lumpur feels like going back to reality.
